The First Amendment must protect modern channels of expression. Banning TikTok would be a direct violation of the Constitution and our rights as Americans.

It can sometimes be difficult to find or socialize with people with the same interests and values. TikTok is a great way to enjoy the fundamental right of freedom of association, find a community, and communicate with them no matter where they are located.

In the age of technology, it is essential for lawmakers to evolve with their constituents. Social media plays a major role in staying proactive and engaged with the people you represent.

Countless young adults use TikTok as a means of expression and communication. This is the same generation that will be making the decisions in future elections. It's incredibly important for lawmakers to consider how a ban could impact so many young people's lives.

I urge you to stand firm on constitutional principles, reject fearmongering rhetoric and oppose any ban on TikTok.
